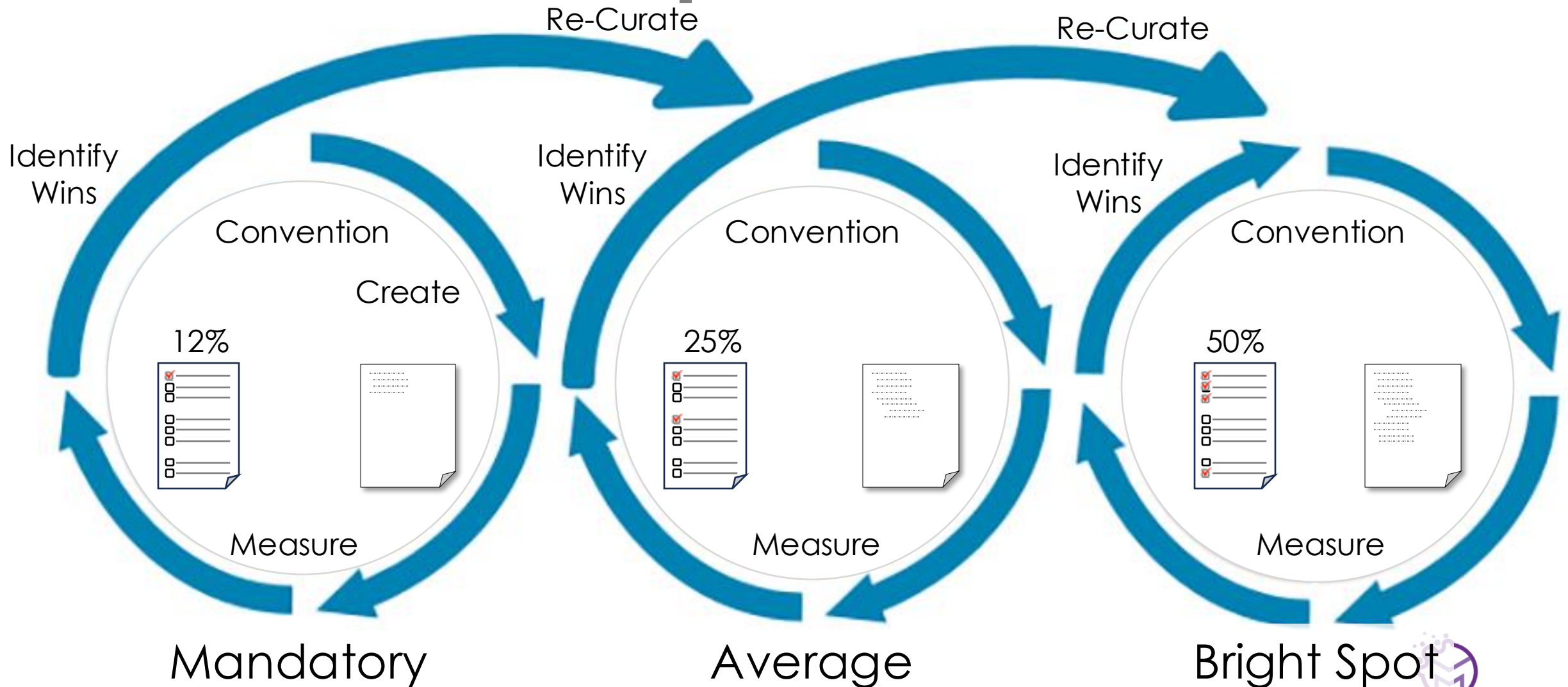
Metadata Detail @ DataCite



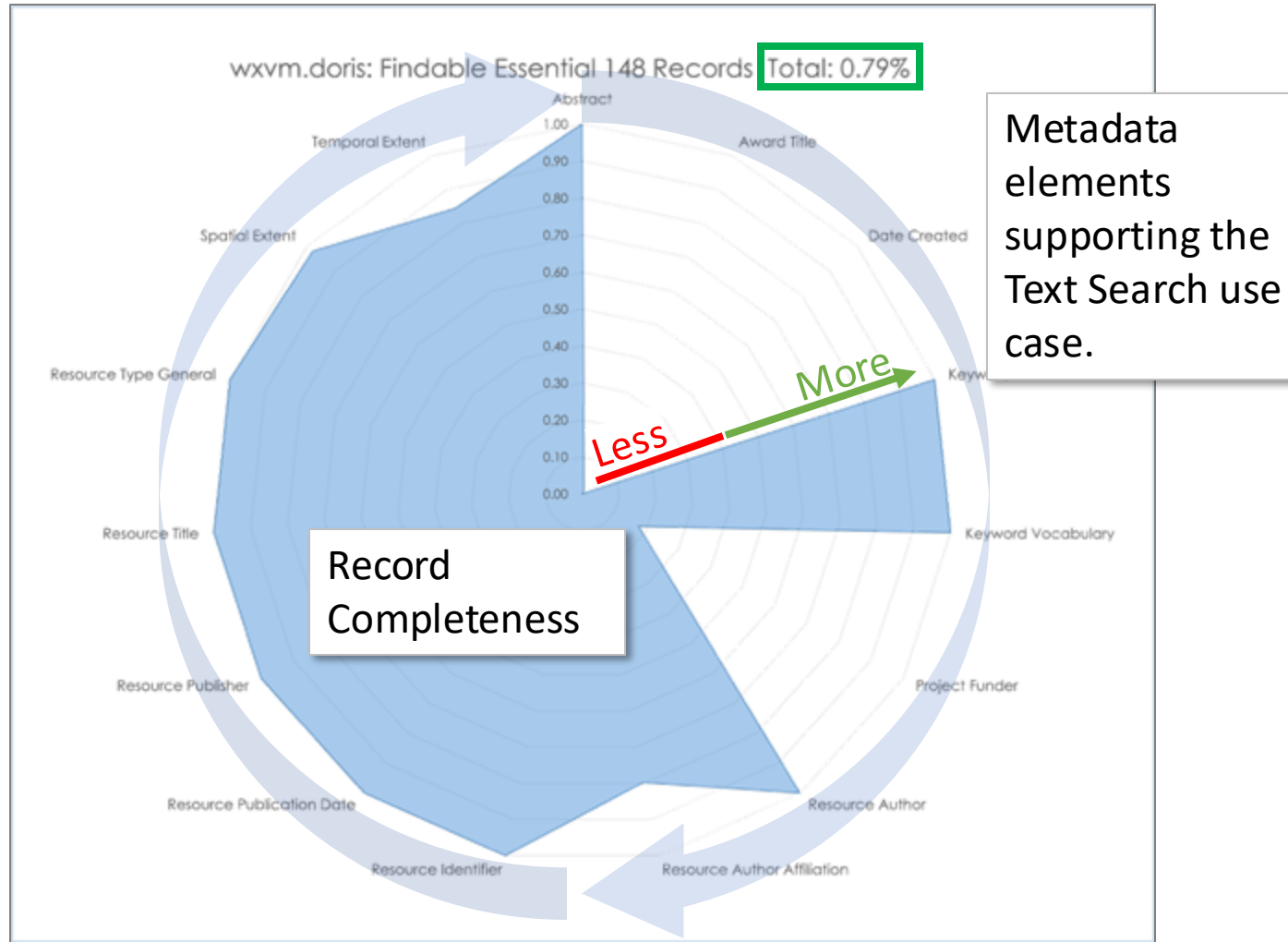
DataCite Metadata Use Cases

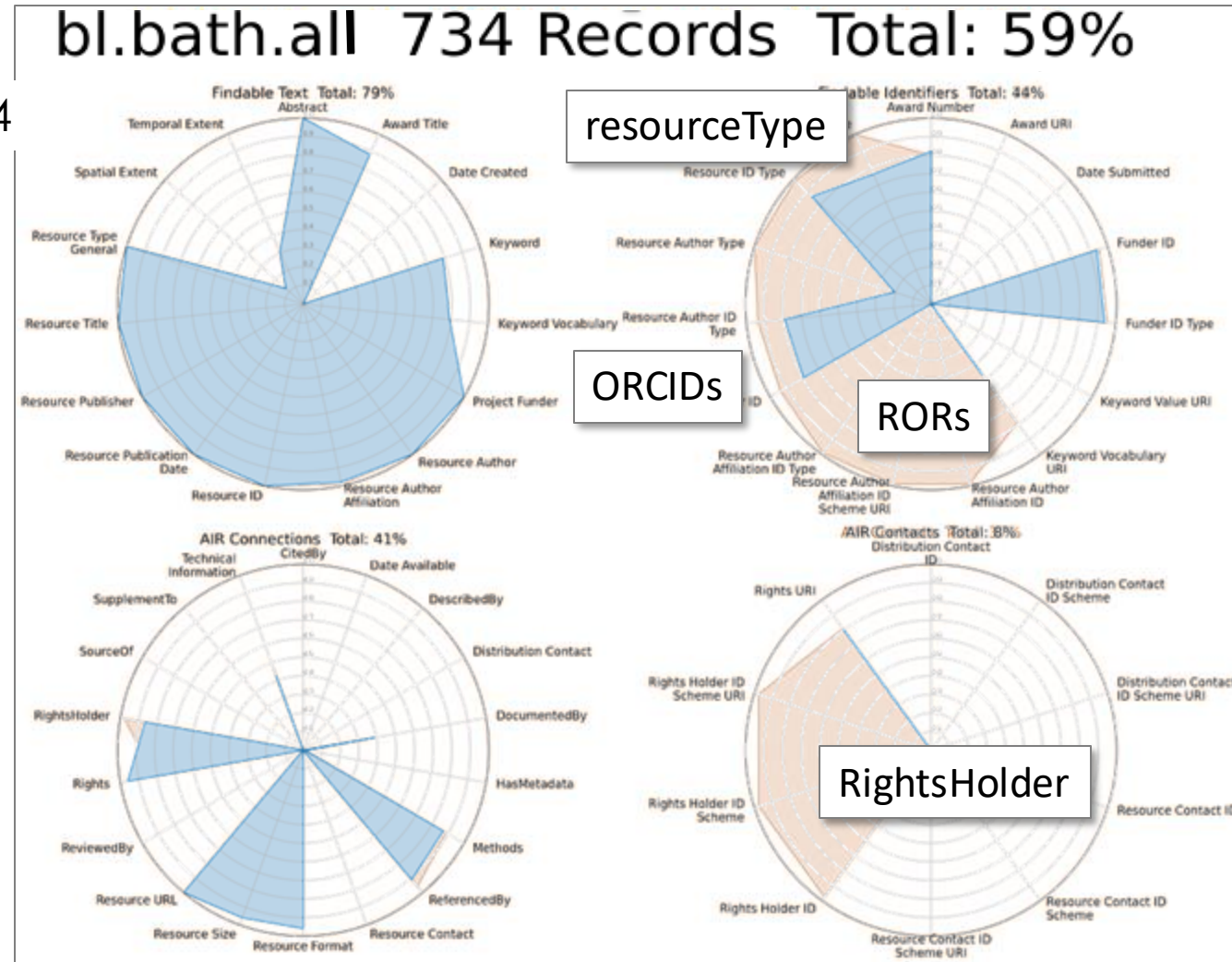

During 2024 the University of Bath took on a metadata improvement process focused on RORs and Rights. This iterative improvement increased their score from 46 to 59%.
